

2007 Tropical Cyclone Fatalities

Tropical Storms and hurricanes claimed just one life in 2007, up from the ideal of 0 in 2006. The one fatality was a male senior citizen in the 80-89 year age range who lived in Texas. There were 17 named tropical storms in 2007, of which 6 had wind speeds that measured hurricane force, compared to 10 named storms in 2006 of which 5 reached hurricane criteria. The Pacific Basin was slightly less active than the Atlantic with 15 named storms: 4 Hurricanes and 11 Tropical Storms, down from 21 in 2006.
