

2014 Winter Weather Fatalities

There were 21 winter storm deaths in 2014, tying the 2013 number. This number is still below the 10-year average of 27. Idaho numbered the most fatalities, 5, followed by Kentucky and North Carolina with 3 each. The most hazardous place to be in the winter of 2014 again was in a vehicle, where 10 (48%) died. In a rare change from most years when many more males die than females, there were 8 (38%) male victims and 10 (48%) female winter fatalities.
