

2010 Tropical Cyclone Fatalities

Despite an extremely active hurricane season, hurricanes and tropical storms claimed no lives in the United States in 2010, down from 2 victims in 2009. There were 21 named tropical storms in the Atlantic Basin in 2010, of which 11 had wind speeds that measured hurricane force, well above 2009, which numbered 11 named storms, 3 of which became hurricanes. The key factor was that none made landfall on the United States, although South Texas felt impacts of several storms that made landfall Mexico. In a switch, the Pacific Basin was less active than the Atlantic with 12 named storms: 3 Hurricanes and 9 Tropical Storms, down from 20 in 2009.
