


WFO Portland, OR, Columbia River Gorge Public Weather Forecast Zones Effective December 3, 2013



The four new WFO PQR Columbia River Gorge zones will replace the existing western Columbia River Gorge Zones. Two zones each are on the Washington and Oregon sides of the river.

1. **ORZ015, Western Columbia River Gorge:** Oregon portion of the Western Columbia River Gorge, from 3 miles east of Cascade Locks to 1 mile west of Corbett. The south boundary is 3 miles south of the Columbia River. This zone includes the communities of Cascade Locks and Corbett, as well as the popular recreation location of Rooster Rock. The majority of this zone would fall within Multnomah County, with a small portion near Cascade Locks within Hood River County.
2. **ORZ016, Central Columbia River Gorge:** Oregon portion of the Central Columbia River Gorge, from 3 miles east of Cascade Locks to the Hood River/Wasco County line. The south boundary is 3 miles south of the Columbia River. This zone includes the city of Hood River and Viento State Park, and resides completely within Hood River County.
3. **WAZ045, Western Columbia River Gorge:** The Washington portion of the Western Columbia River Gorge, from 3 miles east of Stevenson, westward to the eastern city limits of Washougal. The north boundary is 3 miles north of the Columbia River. This zone includes the communities of Stevenson, Skamania and North Bonneville. The majority of this zone falls within Skamania County, though a very small portion of the west end falls within Clark County.
4. **WAZ046, Central Columbia River Gorge:** Washington portion of the Central Columbia River Gorge, from 1 mile west of Carson, eastward to the Skamania/Klickitat county line. The north boundary is 3 miles north of the Columbia River. This zone includes the towns of Carson and Underwood and resides completely within Skamania County.
